

Costuming Information

Because we offer student productions free of charge to our participants, we expect parents to assume responsibility for procuring and paying for their student's costumes and props. Your student may be cast in more than one role (understudy), in which case, you may need to purchase an additional costume or props.

If your student is cast for the play, but you are unable to afford a costume, please visit with the director about options. We can help you come up with an inexpensive or cost-free option.

We have a volunteer costumer for this production. If your student is cast in a role, you may purchase a costume through our costumer for \$50. You may need to purchase additional props and accessories.

ALL costumes must be pre-approved by the director, so feel free to shop if you want to, but be sure to get approval before you order anything.

If you have never costumed a student for a play, you may have a tendency to pick something that is complex and beautifully made. We all want our kids to look good, but costuming that way rarely works. You may be disappointed with what you feel is a badly made or plain costume for your student. But directors and stage managers really do know what they're doing, and you can trust them. Your student will look wonderful on the stage in the end.

A parents costuming meeting will be scheduled for every production. This meeting is mandatory if your student has an acting role in the play. Mark your calendar!
